

### Trust In St. Joseph And You Will See What Miracles Are

He was a carpenter by profession, a dreamer, a simple man who believed entirely in the providence of God. His life centres on his creator and all that he demanded of him as a creature. His belief in his God surpasses all else in his life and no inconvenience was too big as far as God's plan had to be fulfilled. That is why he is still a mystery saint.

'Trust in St. Joseph and you will see what miracles are.'....... the emphasis is on trust. I always believe that St. Joseph is a "Jara hattke" saint. i.e. he is much different than other saints – his silence is louder than his words, his simple job sufficient to feed his family, his dreams, an important part of his travelling itinerary and his family was his social life.

He has no spoken words to his credit, no astounding miracles in his lifetime, no achievements to boast of. Yet the Church gives him the highest acknowledged titles: Husband of Mary, Foster Father of Jesus, Patron of the Church, Guardian of the Holy Family..... titles, no one can lay claim to! Not only the Church, but Yahweh chose him...Joseph do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife.....and from then on began his topsyturvy life. One dream .... And he married Mary; a second dream and he left for Egypt, a third dream and he returned to Nazareth. The dreams, interspersed with the decree of Ceasar Augustus, takes him to Bethlehem. He was the chosen man to fulfil God's Prophesies. Do we realise that like St. Joseph, each one of us is called to fulfil the prophesies of God which will change the course of history?

So, in the light of these facts, can we boldly say: Trust in St. Joseph and you will see what miracles are? Many say that St. Joseph is a slow saint. I believe that trusting St. Joseph is a sure way to change one's life. So, trusting St. Joseph is, in a way, trusting oneself.



one's ability to be the change one wants to see. The miracles may not be the glamorous ones but they are surely the useful - to - life ones. So trusting in St. Joseph is quite easy. He makes no demands, but like the good carpenter that he is, he keeps on sawing, shaving and polishing till we become what God wants us to be. We cannot forget the fact that St. Joseph will ultimately help us to do God's will – silently and serenely.

There are many instances in the lives of our FMA sisters, wherein, they mention the protection of St. Joseph in the guise of an older man, assisting them in their travels, of student sisters who placed little chits at his feet, to help them in their exams and succeeded beyond their expectations, of sisters who kept an empty bread basket and on their return, found it filled with bread. You must have also heard of the special staircase in a convent, built by one single carpenter and one who disappeared without charging his fees. St. Joseph is a

saint – behind – the – scenes, and it is right and fitting that we lean upon this saint, the dad of Jesus, the hubby of Mary and trust him not only to work miracles in our life but to enlighten our minds to recognise them in our daily movements of life.

So dear friends, just 'Trust in St. Joseph and you will see what a miracle you are.'

#### Woman for all times

MM Mumbai encounters Mother Mazzarello in Mother Yvonne.

Turning the pages of the Chronicles of our Institute we see that Mother Mazzarello understood, from the suggestions and example of Don Bosco, that visits can enhance communion between the Sisters and the houses. From that time, she became a pilgrim, constantly travelling, seeking to give birth to and consolidate communities where charity is lived, communities in a constant state of conversion, in which the love of God is felt and daily nourished, so that it can become a regenerating force for fraternal and apostolic life.

Her visits were lived as a time of communion, of encounter, of joy. She visited with love and was capable of noticing many little gestures and many needs, and she reached out to each one personally. will give an identity to the Institute. Each one has to grow in her talents and potentials. Each flower has to bloom before it withers away. Be the light of Jesus which always radiates Jesus in all relationships. Live each stage of formation faithfully and live your life to the full. Be open to your superiors especially when you have to face difficulties. Jesus accompanies us with his grace when he entrusts us with his mission"

Her concluding message to the Sisters touched the hearts when she said, "The Sisters of the Mumbai Province will be very close to my heart since I came to know you a little better now in these 10 days. Continue your journey with new enthusiasm and passion, giving importance to vocations. Those who love never grow old because love makes everything new every day and you remain young when you love. Thank you for your missionary spirit, for your attentiveness to the needy and your mission among the young. My feet go towards the Mother house but my heart shall always remain in Mumbai Province. God bless you all".

Indeed Mother Mazzarello was truly present in our midst.

### 10 DAYS JOURNEY OF MOTHER YVONNE

### Day 1 - 1st March

The long awaited day finally arrived. Our dearest Mother General, Mother Yvonne Reungoat, arrived at , Chhatrapati Shivaji International Airport Mumbai at 2.45 pm. Mother was warmly welcomed by our Provincial Sr. Ritha Dora Thomas, Provincial Economer Sr. Rita D'Souza, Provincial Secretary Sr. Supriya Noronha and a good number of Sisters.

At the Provincial House, Auxilium Centre, Bandra, Mother was welcomed by young people, Sisters, teachers and the support staff. She was greeted in traditional Indian style and escorted to the Chapel.

The 'Veni Creator' was solemnly sung and a hymn to Our Blessed Mother was intoned. Mother lit a candle in front of the statue of Mary and thanked Mary for her powerful help.

She joined the Sisters for tea and shared a light moment with them.













### Day 2 - 2nd March

Our beloved Mother Yvonne Reungoat, was warmly welcomed by the Superiors of the Goa-Karnataka region at the Dabolim Airport, Goa at 7.15 am. They then proceeded to St. Francis Xavier Convent, Benaulim where the sisters, students, past pupils, co-operators and ADMA members greeted her with flowers, smiles, cheers and song. It was indeed a colourful and joyful welcome.

We then met as one family around the Eucharistic table. Fr. Avil Rodrigues sdb, the Vice-Provincial of the Konkan Province was the main celebrant. Fourteen other Salesians concelebrated along with him. At 3.00 pm the sisters along with Mother proceeded towards Auxilium Convent, Caranzalem. Here she was in for another colourful surprise as the students escorted her with different dances. The sisters, the staff members and the co-operators joyfully greeted her with songs.



























### Day 3 - 3rd March

The programme was followed by the Holy Eucharist presided by his grace Archbishop Filipe Neri Ferrao, the Parish Priest Fr Lucio Dias and the Chaplain Fr. Eremito Coutinho. The Archbishop expressed his thanks to the Superior General for the mission carried out by the Salesian Sisters in the Archdiocese. He made a special mention about our presence at Sindoni in Daman, where the sisters work enthusiastically with the tribals.

Mother Yvonne then addressed the Salesian Family represented by co-operators, past pupils, the PTA, staff members and ADMA. She stressed on the fact that 'We are family', and together we must continue the mission of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello in reaching out to the young. In the evening the sisters of the Benaulim community along with Mother Yvonne and the Provincial set out for a short pilgrimage to the Shrine of Bom Jesus at Old Goa to venerate the relics of St. Francis Xavier. Fr. Patricio Fernandes SJ, the Rector of Bom Jesus community explained to them the history and devotion related to the place.



### Day 4 - 4th March

Around 4.30 pm Mother Yvonne accompanied by our Provincial Sr. Ritha Dora Thomas and the Provincial Councillors left for Auxilium Convent, Pali Hill, Bandra. The hills of Pali were resounding with joyful shouts of "Welcome Mother" as our beloved Mother Yvonne was given a grand welcome on her maiden visit as Superior General to our Province. The sisters and the exuberant Auxilians escorted Mother General into the portals of Auxilium Convent, Pali Hill, with fragrant flowers and an energetic display of Maharashtrian folk dances.

Mother Yvonne was overwhelmed with their breathtaking performance at the end of which she was invited to pose for a picture with the students. She then addressed the gathering and congratulated the students for their excellent performance. #### Day 8 - 8th March

There was a short musical enacted by the SHG women of Dakor that depicted the achievements of women in different fields.





























### Day 9 - 9th March

The students of the Gujarati and English medium schools staged a combined programme to showcase the culture and traditions of Gujarat.

What a grand sight it was to see her and the entire crowd watching her riding in the chariot. The atmosphere was so colourful, joyful and attractive. The students dressed in multicoloured 'chanya cholis' welcomed Mother Yvonne with dance, music and flowers.

Mother Yvonne was invited to address the gathering. She began by thanking all for the grand welcome, appreciated the culture that is rich in human values and praised the children for their performance.

She stressed on the role of girls which is very important in the social world for the future of life, for the future of peace and solidarity. She urged them to be true to the words inscribed on the school building 'to love one another'. She emphasized that we live our differences in daily life,the difference of culture, languages, religion etc., and to build a new society, a new world is the responsibility of the parents, teachers and Sisters.

Mother Yvonne reached Pushpanjali, Dakor at 11.30 am and was welcomed with garlands by Sr. Sunanda Solanki, the animator of Dakor and Sr. Melna, the animator of the SMI community, breaking of a coconut and a group of women carrying 'kalash' on their heads on either side of the pathway. She was surrounded by the Sisters, students, boarders, teachers and support staff of Dakor, Salesian Fathers, the SMI Sisters, and the Sister Disciples commonly known as 'behenjis'.

At 12.30 pm there was a solemn Holy Eucharist at the SDB Parish Church of Christ the King celebrated by the Archbishop of Gandhinagar diocese Rt. Rev. Thomas Macwan. The concelebrants were the Vicar General of the Ahmedabad diocese.

At 5.45 pm Mother Yvonne was welcomed with flowers, 'kumkum'. She was led in procession from the gate to the stage with a variety of lively dances performed by the school children, tuition children and the boarders of Jag Prakash Chatralaya, Pansora. They were draped in gorgeous





costumes beautifully decked to add colour and beauty to the occasion. The dignitaries were felicitated with floral tributes.

The presence of all the groups: tuition children, boarders, school children and Self-Help Group helped us to give Mother Yvonne a true picture of the mission in Pansora. The enthusiasm among those gathered was great. There was a lot of joy and happiness seen on their faces.













































### Day 10 - 10th March

Mother Yvonne arrived at Pali Hill Bandra at 11.30 am and joined in the Eucharist Banquet at 11:45 am. The Holy Eucharist was presided over by His Lordship Rt. Rev. John Rodrigues Auxiliary Bishop of Bombay Diocese. The Mass began with Mother Yvonne and Sr. Rita Dora walking in procession to the symbolic fountain of water near the altar where, in a symbolic gesture of quenching the spiritual thirst of the INB Province and rejuvenating the Salesian charism, Mother Yvonne graciously poured water from her jar into the jar which Sr. Ritha Dora was holding. #### MY EXPERIENCE

Guwahati: The four Sisters Rita D'Souza, Savina Naik, Meenal Bhosale and Smitha Gonsalves ventured out from Mumbai to the distant North-East of India, to the city of Guwahati to participate in the 10th Faith Exposure Programme, organized by Archbishop emeritus of Guwahati Rev. Thomas Menamparambil and Fr. Varghese. the Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Guwahati. This event brought together around 700 participants, all young formees i.e. Aspirants, Postulants, Junior Sisters and minor Seminarians as well as a few young Priests belonging to around 40+ Congregations and they were divided into 63 groups. It began with a solemn Eucharistic celebration followed by an introductory session by Fr. Varghese. "Don't be afraid, just stand still and watch; the Lord will walk with you today, the Lord himself will fight for you, stay calm" (Ex13:14). With this assurance of the Lord they began the programme with full vigor to move out to the assigned villages in the Garo hills.

The day began at 4.00 am with adoration, morning prayers animated each day by various Congregations, Holy



Eucharist, followed by a cup of tea with a few biscuits. Then they had 2 hours of continuous listening to the sharing of missionary life by several priests and nuns working in North East India. After an early lunch at 9.30 am, they moved to the respective villages with the groups and returned to the base at 4.30 pm in the evening. Once again we had to listen to 2hours of sharing of missionary life. Supper was served at 9.30pm. Each evening, groups were assigned to present a cultural programme to the "missionaries" and the day concluded at 11.00 pm with a solemn Night prayer.

The villagers we met were really simple people like the people spoken of in the gospels. We went to give them Jesus through our thoughts, deeds and especially with our smiles and kind words, being assured of the unfailing promise of the Lord: "I will put my words into your mouth and I will direct you what to speak"(Jer 1:19)The Spirit of the Lord did work in us and through us, although language was a big barrier since the local people speak only the Garo and Assamese language, with no knowledge whatsoever of Hindi. However, we were able to communicate Christ and His love with our smiles and friendly deeds. We taught them action songs, played with the children, gave them some tips on hygiene and emphasized the need for education sincea good number there are dropouts from school. The villages have a majority of Christians of the Baptist denomination, some Hindus and a few Catholic families. The Catholics willingly accepted and listened to us but a few Baptist families were reluctant to accept us. However, the Lord's words that "some will hate you because of me" (Mt 10:22) did come true during our visits to the families.



However, this experience has really enriched us: to be missionaries in our own vicinity being an answer to someone else's prayer helps us to find answers to our own queries. For a zealous missionary who wants to make Christ known to others, language can never become a barrier because Love is the only language that can truly communicate Christ to others. We thank our Provincial Sr. Rita Dora for giving us the opportunity of this rich and wonderful experience and we also express out thanks to Sr. Elizabeth George, the Provincial of Guwahati Province and all her sisters for their warm hospitality and kindness towards us during our stay there. May the God of love fill their lives with His Love so that may you continue to radiate that love to all. "Lord we are the clay in your hands; use us as instruments to spread Your Kingdom of love".

# MY EXPERIENCE AT SAHAYINI SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT SOCIETY, WADALA

"Two roads diverged in a wood, and I,

I took the one less traveled by,

And that has made all the difference. – Robert Frost"

The reason I started with a verse from Robert Frost's "The Road Not Taken" is self-explanatory, although I had always had many opportunities to make choices and choosing a path that would push the limits of my abilities; and it was here at Sahayini that I learned to extend my potential and unseen capabilities.

I had joined Sahayini as an English and Soft Skills Trainer in the month of April. I was feeling out of place since I had just moved to Mumbai and I found a place like home at Sahayini. The ambience and presence of the place was ever so welcoming. The most comforting experience I had was of helping students who were feeling displaced; they were from underprivileged and marginalized families. They were ones who influenced me and thus, I had decided and continued training in Sahayini as I know and believe that God has sent me here for a reason, to share my knowledge and resources with those who were limited with such essentials.

It was not only the students who had motivated me by their presence, it was also the Sisters of the Mazarrello Youth Community who had fortified my vision into a mission; because of them I had been inspired to redefine the passion I had towards students. When I joined as a trainer for Communicative English, Soft Skills and Life Skills, I learnt a great deal from Reverend Sister Rosaline especially on how to motivate myself, to be much audible and accessible in order to facilitate the students better.

All through the course of my 11 months in Sahayini, I learnt a lot about my shortcomings, my limitations and my weaknesses. Noticeably, in the first few months, I was very soft spoken and I had been motivated to change my outlook and enrich my personality. I also had witnessed a drastic change in the implications of the methods used for teaching ESL (English Second Learners), as my methods evolved to more of activity-oriented methods and fun methods of teaching. I learned how this NGO functions by understanding that it is a part of a much larger picture by



witnessing a function where many different centres of all over India collaborated in producing events for children. One such event was "The Diwali Dhamaka Event" which was conducted for orphan children where I had the opportunity to encourage my students to be volunteers and for me as well to be a judge for their drawing competition. I felt very privileged and honoured and at the same time humbled and blessed to be a part of such a great cause. I would also like to mention that I had many accounts to take students on Exposure visits, be as an acting placement officer, calling up companies and requesting for student vacancies. I had the opportunity students for interviews and getting them placed in companies: Two of our ITES students, Rosmary and Sony were selected on the first round at Hansa Direct Pvt. Ltd., Andheri. Another instance where students were taken for an Interview at PAMAC at Wadala and a student named Madhura is still working there. I have also had many opportunities where I had to take full responsibility for students and manage their travel and food expenses. I felt very capable after completing the assigned task and being responsible for others.

I am indeed very grateful to Sister Rosaline in every respect for the bountiful opportunities that were given to me. On the skill level, I have learnt how to multitask handling different batches at a time and I have learnt a great deal on Work Politics, which would defiantly help me to resolve any work related issues in future. All these recurring events at Sahayini have motivated me and changed me for the better. On a personal level and career wise and I am happy to take with me all the great experiences I had. Thank you Sister Rosaline, Sister Moksha and Team Sahayini for all the liberty, support and guidance that you have given me in helping me become a better trainer and a better person. Once again, I am most grateful to everyone in Sahayini for all that I was and all that I have become.




